## Albert Einstein

Albert Einstein, the great physicist, is perhaps best known for having developed the theory of general relativity (*and this actually matters in the everyday world: your GPS wouldn't be possible if it weren't for Einstein*). He created a revolution in physics that affected our way of looking at the universe and our place in it.

When Albert Einstein was still formulating his theories, he was a clerk in a patent office in Bern, Switzerland, a job he took after spending years trying to find a teaching post. Few recognized Einstein's greatness – but he knew that he was onto something – he'd always been a dreamer, but a dreamer who knew that his dreams were those that would revolutionize science. Einstein had the determination to keep going in the face of the indifference of his colleagues and those around him.

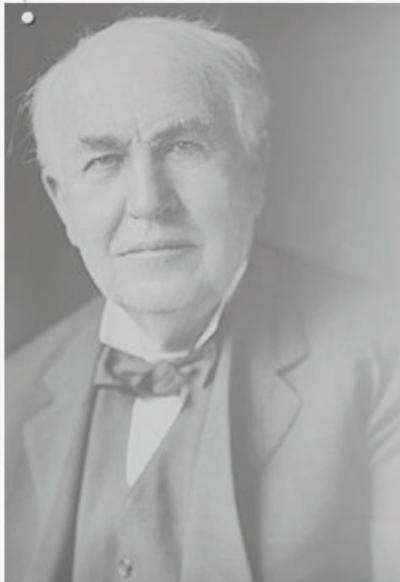


## Meryl Streep

Meryl Streep has garnered more Academy Award nominations than any other actor in history – 17 – and into her 60s, she remains a box-office draw, which is rare in youth-centric Hollywood.

She has proved her mettle in a variety of roles, from Polish immigrant to British prime minister, from Danish writer to demanding fashion editor. Yet in each of these roles, Streep has presented a fully fleshed-out human, not a caricature. She seeks to present humanity in all its flaws, and give you a psychological portrait that is at once compelling and entertaining.

While you may not share Einstein's scientific prowess, you do share with Einstein an ability to think abstractly and to act in reality. While you may not have Meryl Streep's chameleon-like ability to lose yourself in a role (and seem to become another person), while offering real insights into human nature, you do share with Streep an ability to interpret the actions of others in a way that reveals insights into human nature.



## Thomas Edison

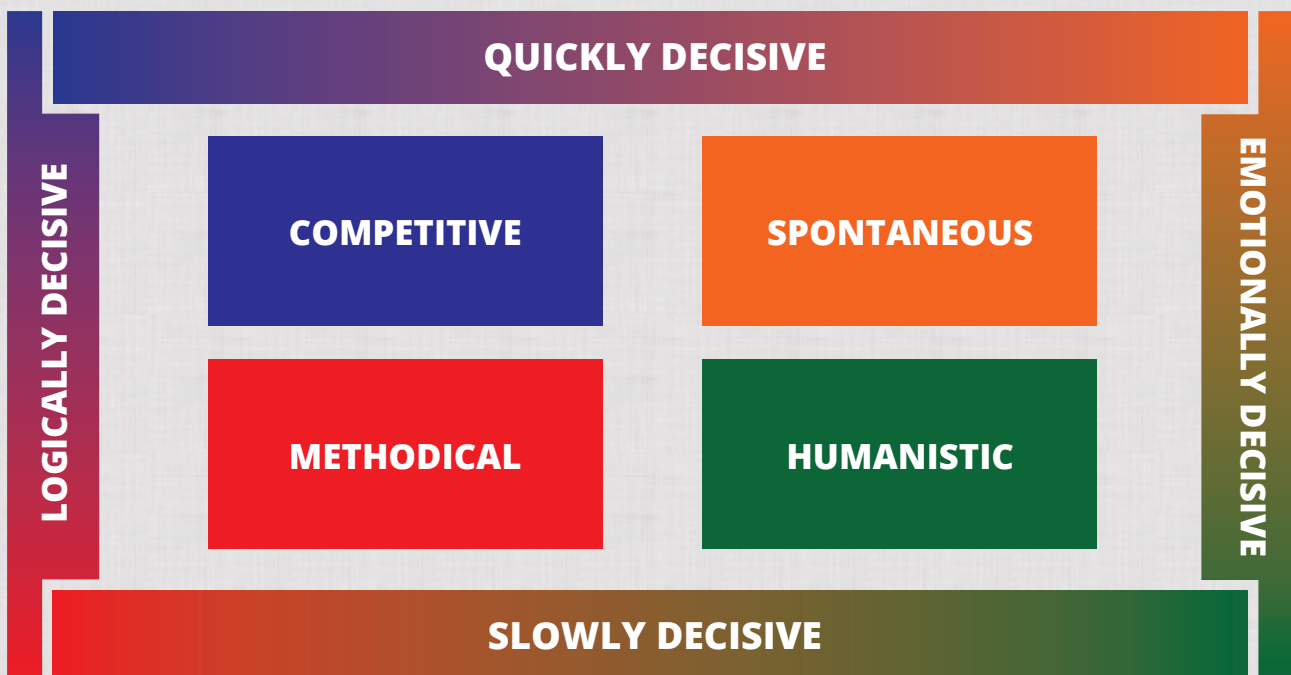
The American inventor and businessman developed many devices that greatly influenced life around the world, including the phonograph, the motion picture camera, and a long-lasting, practical electric light bulb. Dubbed "The Wizard of Menlo Park" (now Edison, New Jersey), he was one of the first inventors to apply the principles of mass production and teamwork to the process of invention, and is credited with the creation of the first industrial research laboratory.

Edison is the fourth most prolific inventor in history, holding 1,093 U.S. patents in his name, as well as many patents in the United Kingdom, France, and Germany.

A little know fact about Edison is this; he didn't do a lot of the inventing himself. He was brilliant at organizing mastermind events and bringing people together. Through leadership he would create and invent as the head of teams that brought about great transformation in inventing.

## Like the Heroes Einstein, Streep and Edison you have the following qualities

- You can be fast-acting, but also detached.
